The field has been mown for hay, and all is ready for you to come and join the Parks Trust and Woughton Community Council for a fun-filled day exploring the life of a researcher, identifying




dinosaur fossils, and hunting for dinosaur eggs on a trail. All ages welcome but children must be accompanied by an adult. Just turn up and enjoy!

V11 Roundabouts



Puzzled at what's going on around Brinklow roundabout (V11/H8)? As well as installing the traffic lights, they are resurfacing the areas shown in dark blue on the map. And they have decided to close all the areas marked in red overnight while they do it, from 8pm to 6am Sunday-Thursday nights, despite our protest at the disruption this causes. Light blue areas stay open.

Preparatory work on the Monkston (V11/H7) roundabout will be done over Christmas with the main work starting next spring/summer.

Help for Users of BSL

Residents who use British Sign Language can now get help with interpretation of conversations with the Council over a video call using the SignLive app. The app can also help deaf customers with phonecalls to the Council. See 'Contact Us' on the Council's website for more information.

Paying the Bills

Many people are struggling to pay bills. If you're on Universal Credit you need to apply separately for the Council Tax reduction. And if you are a pensioner on housing benefit or on less than the new State Pension, you may be entitled to Pension Credit. Fire Risk

The heat is due to return and the Fire Service ask please don't light *any* sort of fire, barbeque, etc. outdoors in very hot weather. Even a single spark can start a fire after such dry hot weather, and it can spread very quickly over a very wide area. So gather outside - but do the BBQ in the kitchen. And remember, you need permission at any time to hold a BBQ on MK Council or Parks Trust open space.

Final Ward Boundaries

The Boundary Commission announced their final decision. Ouzel Valley ward stays as in the draft, except that Tinkers Bridge has got its wish and stays with Woughton and Fishermead ward.



Sadly, the Council made a mistake last month in saying that the area around Far Holm, Middleton has been adopted. The work needed has been agreed, but can't be done till the autumn. After that, MKCC will adopt the area and the alleys.
